Lenape Valley Foundation to Host Suicide Prevention Conference

Doylestown, PA, August 30, 2019 – Lenape Valley Foundation will host a suicide prevention conference on Monday, October 7. **Least Restrictive Levels of Care for Suicide Prevention** will be held in the Life Sciences Building Auditorium at Delaware Valley University located at 700 E. Butler Avenue in Doylestown from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. The conference is offered in partnership with Delaware Valley University.

The keynote speaker is Charles T. Browning, M.D. Dr. Browning is the Chief Medical Officer of RI International. He has devoted his career to improving the systems and care experience for our mental health needs. He has held leadership positions in public and private systems of care including Crisis System Care, Assertive Community Treatment Team, rural community behavioral health care company, and Opioid Treatment Programs. Dr. Browning graduated from North Carolina State University, University of North Carolina Chapel Hill Medical School, and completed his internship and residency at University of North Carolina. Dr. Browning has also practiced in the NC prison psychiatric system and his own private practice. He has special interests in promoting several thought leadership initiatives in collaboration with RI International including Crisis Now, Zero Suicide, Peer 2.0, and The Fusion Model.

The day will include afternoon breakout sessions. One of these sessions will feature the viewing of the film, *Here One Day*, presented by the filmmaker Kathy Leichter. Leichter is an award-winning producer and director of social issue and historical documentaries. She is the founder and president of Mint Leaf Productions and Two Suns Media. *Here One Day* (Two Suns Media) is an award-winning, feature-length documentary about mental illness and suicide in the filmmaker's family. Leichter is currently implementing a national, multi-year media outreach campaign using the film and community dialogue to reduce stigma around mental illness and suicide, connect audiences to support, teach how mental illness and suicide impact families, and improve mental health policy.
