As the state and locally designated Single County Authority (SCA) for alcohol, tobacco and other drugs, our agency will work continuously to ensure the provision of a comprehensive and balanced continuum of quality prevention, intervention and treatment services for the county.

How to Access Treatment and Other Services

- The first step in accessing treatment is to have a drug and alcohol assessment to determine the type of treatment and recovery plan needed.
- Assessments will occur in person or via telehealth.

BPAIR (Bucks County Police Assisting in Recovery.)

Process:

- ❖ The Police Department will pair the individual with a volunteer who will accompany them to an assessment site.



Help for Adolescents

Act 53 is a law in the state of Pennsylvania that allows a parent/legal guardian to obtain a drug and alcohol assessment for their child – and, if warranted, compel the child to enter treatment. You can encourage the resident to give AOC a call to learn more about Act 53 and other resources.
